2019 saw the opening of 'The Hangar', a wonderful space that allows our school and community gather en masse, out of the elements, to share in Assemblies, Chapel Services and special events. It provides a state of the art sporting surface for our teams, and a Parade Ground for the 252 Army Cadet Unit. It goes without saying that this facility has been a wonderful addition to our school. 2020 sees our school embark on further exciting building projects and future planning.

This year in June we look forward to seeing the start of construction on our new library facility. This will also include an Administration area, Reception and Student Service Desk. Its location behind the existing Media Centre will further centre our staff and teacher services to the School and provide a purpose built facility. On completion early 2021 we will move to construct our Early Learning Centre incorporating many new exciting features for both Preschool and Kindergarten children. As we grow to a School beyond 500 we need to continue to develop a thriving environment that services the growing needs of our student population and dynamic staff team. I am looking forward to sharing further information with you as we progress through this process.



Towards the end of last year I wrote to families canvassing for those who are most affected by the drought and trying to gain a better understanding of the significant impact of our current circumstances. In meeting with the Prime Minister last week I was able to discuss those challenges and am pleased to announce that we are to receive \$76,000 of relief funding to directly benefit those families challenged by drought. The Morrison Government is committed to supporting school communities. Helping maintain schools' viability in the face of cost pressures will ensure continuity of education for students from drought-affected families and that schools continue to be a central and stabilising force across communities in times of hardship. I would like to thank Mr Morrison, not only for taking the time to listen to our situational needs, but responding in action with compassion for those that he serves. Over the next fortnight I will be working with those families affected and providing them some much needed financial relief.

This coming Monday we will host our annual Swimming Carnival at the Orange Aquatic Centre. This is a great event that builds community and house spirit amongst our students as they support and encourage their peers.

OAGS 'Parents and Friends' will be hosting welcome drinks at the Greenhouse on Friday 28 February from 6:30pm. I look forward to attending, and encourage new and existing families to come along to this relaxed event to hear of the way we can work together as parents, friends and staff of our school to build community and lend a helping hand where possible. I would like to thank outgoing P & F President Mrs Elise Kane for her commitment to building collaborative relationships within the P & F in 2019. I look forward to working with new President Mr Jon Baker and the Executive and members of the P & F in 2020.

Library@OAGS

Welcome to a new school year! The Library@OAGS is a busy place of literature, learning, relaxing, fun, making and investigating.

Library Bags:

Transition students will receive a navy school library bag from Mrs Drury.

Kindergarten students have their new school library bags for borrowing and families will have been notified of borrowing days via Dojo. New students have received a school library bag in their first library session with

Ms Taylor.

Borrowing:

Initially, Kindergarten is limited to one book per week whilst they are establishing good borrowing and return habits. It is expected that school library books are cared for in the home to avoid damage. If a library book or bag is damaged or lost in any way, please notify Ms Taylor as soon as possible and replacements can be organised.

Secondary school students may be issued with novels and textbooks for study. It is expected that these are returned to the library when no longer required.

Book Club: Once or twice per term students in Transition to Year 6 will bring home a Book Club catalogue for ordering. The due date will be stamped on the catalogue. It is preferable that orders are made online using the LOOP function. Instructions for that are on the catalogue. Class

names have been updated. Cash orders are accepted but it is very important that the order details are clear and legible and the students names and class are added. Cash orders are to be sent to Admin. Orders and deliveries are managed by Ms Taylor. Deliveries are sent to classrooms for distribution by the classroom teacher. This is a wonderful scheme that allows the school to collect points which can be spent on classroom resources.

PRC:

The Premier's Reading Challenge commences on Monday, March 2nd. Students from Kindergarten to Year 2 will complete the challenge in class with their teachers. Students in Stage 2 and 3 will complete individually. I look forward to seeing many more Gold certificates this year, and maybe even a Platinum! More details about this to come.




